This course is designed to meet the regulatory training requirements for facility persons in charge as outlined in 33 CFR 154.710 (d). This course is a site-specific course, which includes specific company operations. Classroom lecture and field practical exercises will be included in this training.

**Liquefied Hazardous Gas (LHG)
Facility PIC Training Course
(2-Day Course)**

This course is designed to meet the regulatory training requirements for facility persons in charge as outlined in 33 CFR 127.1301. The LHG dock operations course is a site-specific course, which includes specific company operations. Classroom lecture and field practical exercises will be included in this training.

**OPA-90 Qualified Individual/On-Scene Incident Commander Course
(5-Day Course)**

This course is designed for qualified individuals and incident management team members. This is a site-specific course and includes specific procedures in accordance with the facility's spill response plan. HAZWOPER training is also included. The course includes classroom lectures as well as practical exercises and spill drills.
